# New Mexico Writers 2026 Grant Program Opens December 1

New Mexico and Navajo writers seeking financial support and recognition for their work may apply for the annual grants offered by New Mexico Writers (NMW). The grants provide funding for new writing as well as works in progress.



Applications are accepted in the following genres: fiction, nonfiction, poetry, journalism, playwriting, and screenwriting. Grants are typically between

\$500 and \$2,000 and are intended to support a variety of writer's needs, including attendance at a writing-related workshop, conference, or mentorship program; research-related travel costs; time away from work to focus on a writing project; and more.

There are three grant categories:

- **New Mexico Writers Annual Grant**: The NMW signature grant supports writing, research, publishing, and other activities pertaining to the creation of new works or works in progress.
- **Douglas Preston Travel Grant**: This annual \$1,000 grant, funded by best-selling author and Santa Fe resident Douglas Preston, specifically supports an author's travel needs in the service of a writing project.
- **Preston Young Writers Grant**: Supported by author Douglas Preston and his wife Christine, this grant of varying amounts is intended to assist an aspiring young writer between the ages of 18 and 25 obtain professional experience, networking, and training.

Since the program's inception in 2019, New Mexico Writers has awarded more than \$70,000 to 63 writers of all ages, and at all stages of their writing endeavors, from across New Mexico and the greater Navajo Nation. Applications are due via email submission no later than Friday, March 6, 2026.

Grants will be awarded at the 2026 NMW annual dinner, where grantees will be honored as special guests on **April 30, 2026**, at La Fonda on the Plaza in Santa Fe.

## A New Mexico First in Bringing Native Heritage to Life for Blind and Low-Vision Youth Readers



Albuquerque author and 2019 NMW Grantee Laurel Goodluck has broken new ground with the New Mexico State Library for the Blind and Print Disabled (LBPD). Goodluck personally collaborated on the narration of four of her picture books, not just reading the text for the audiobook, but helping craft culturally informed descriptions of the illustrations so blind and low-vision youth readers can fully experience the stories. Until now, these descriptions have been produced by the narrators or library staff; this marks the first time an author has contributed original image narration for New Mexico LBPD.

Goodluck's newly recorded titles, *Fierce Aunties!*, *Rock Your Mocs*, *Too Much*, and *Yáadilá! Good Grief!*, will be added to the National Library Service's audio collection. As an enrolled member of the Mandan, Hidatsa, and Arikara Nations, and an Alaska Native Citizen of the Tsimshian Tribe, Goodluck's work expands access to Native stories for families everywhere and helps pave the way for more inclusive work from New Mexican writers. # New Mexico Bookstores Celebrate NM Book Awards Winners

Local bookstores across New Mexico are shining a light on their local literary talent. In November, both Avalon Books in Silver City and Books on the Bosque in Albuquerque held readings and book signings to celebrate 2025 winners in the New Mexico Book Awards.



Avalon Books hosted a reading and signing with winning authors Linda Brewer,

Sharman Apt Russell, and Marty Eberhardt. An attendee at the event asked what it means to win this award. The authors shared how wonderful it is to receive recognition after all the work done in solitude and to know that they've connected with readers. The Silver City authors commented on how the diverse talents of their small community achieved statewide recognition—the winners included a murder mystery, a nature book, a cookbook, and a photography book.

Books on the Bosque welcomed Vaunda Micheaux Nelson, Korie Leigh PhD, Laurel Goodluck, and Khadijah VanBrakle for readings from their winning books in the children's, early reader, middle grade, and young adult genres. Attendees were graced by two young contributing authors, Aspen Keith (age 17) and Ella Sanchez

(age 9), and the cover artist, Melanie Rodriquez (age 18), for New Mexico Youth Arts Ambassadors' winning book *The Cuentistas: Our Stories*. Ana Romero-Sanchez of Cuentistas Press said, "It may seem a small event to us, but for these young student authors and artists, it can be life-changing."

In addition to the author event, Books on the Bosque put finalist books on display in the bookstore. The director of the NM Book Awards, Lisa McCoy, emphasized the importance of these local celebrations, saying "Authors have expressed excitement and appreciation for having their books showcased in their towns and in their favorite bookstores." UNM Press celebrated their winners and finalists with a book cover display on their website blog.

NM Writers is planning more publicity events around the state for the 2025 honorees. Look for details on events coming next year in future issues of *The New Mexico Writer*.





The WINNER and FINALIST stickers are another way authors and publishers are celebrating. McCoy heard from authors who are visiting local bookstores to attach stickers to their winner or finalist books for readers to discover. "Winners and finalists will be pleased to know the stickers—not already picked up in person—were mailed in November," said McCoy.
